
TEXAS STATE BOARD OF PHARMACY

DISCIPLINARY ACTIONS

June - August 2015

After the Board obtains evidence of alleged violations, a licensee is sent a preliminary notice letter of the Board's intent to institute disciplinary action.

The licensee then has an opportunity to show compliance with the law in an informal conference with the Board staff (Executive Director/Secretary, Board Legal Counsel, and other staff at the discretion of the Executive Director and Board Legal Counsel). If the licensee cannot show compliance with the law and desires to dispose of any pending allegations, the licensee may consent to the entry of an "Agreed Board Order." The licensee must agree to the terms of the order and the order must be approved by the Board.

It should be noted that while there is agreement on the part of the licensee to the entry of an "Agreed Board Order," there is neither admission nor denial of guilt with respect to any matters that have come to the attention of the Board.

If a licensee, or the Board does not agree to terms of the "Agreed Board Order" or if the licensee does not wish an informal conference, a disciplinary hearing is scheduled before an Administrative Law Judge from the Office of Administrative Hearings. The Administrative Law Judge, after hearing all evidence in the matter will make a recommendation to the Board for action to be taken. The Board then makes a decision in the case, which is documented by the entry of a "Board Order."

On the finding of the existence of grounds for discipline of a licensee, the Board may suspend, revoke, restrict, fine, refuse to issue or renew, probate, reprimand, cancel, or retire a license.

HIPDB

The Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act of 1996 established the Healthcare Integrity and Protection Data Bank (HIPDB), a national healthcare fraud and abuse data collection program. In order to implement HIPDB, the U. S. Department of Health and Human Services adopted rules that require all state health licensing agencies to report disciplinary actions imposed on its licensees. The Texas State Board of Pharmacy (TSBP) is required to submit reports to HIPDB regarding all disciplinary actions taken against pharmacists, pharmacies, pharmacist-interns, and pharmacy technicians. After HIPDB receives a report from TSBP, HIPDB will send a copy of the report to the licensee. The licensee will be given the opportunity to respond to the report.

License No. 51233. Alleged violation: as pharmacist-in-charge at Artemis Pharmacy, LLC in Houston, TX, dispensed controlled substances pursuant to invalid prescription orders. Agreed Board Order accepted by licensee and entered by the Board on 08-04-15: 5-year probation with conditions and must successfully pass the pharmacy law exam.

Buckner Village Pharmacy, Pharmacy License No. 23914, Dallas, TX. Alleged violation: dispensed controlled substances pursuant to invalid prescription orders. Agreed Board Order accepted by licensee and entered by the Board on 08-04-15: 2-year probation with conditions and fined \$2500.

BZ Pharmacy, Pharmacy License No. 26966, Houston, TX. Alleged violation: dispensed controlled substances and dangerous drugs pursuant to invalid prescription orders. Agreed Board Order accepted by licensee and entered by the Board on 08-04-15: 2-year probation with conditions; fined \$5000; and must develop and implement policies and procedures to ensure therapeutic dispensing of prescription drugs.

Agreed Board Order accepted by licensee and entered by the Board on 08-04-15: 2-year probation with conditions; fined \$1500; and must develop and implement a Continuous Quality Improvement Program (to include peer review) for purposes of preventing and handling dispensing errors.

CVS/Pharmacy #3177, Pharmacy License No. 24900, Houston, TX. Alleged violations: dispensing error and failed to clarify prescription information with the prescriber. Agreed Board Order accepted by licensee and entered by the Board on 08-04-15: license reprimanded; fined \$1500; and must develop and implement a Continuous Quality Improvement Program (to include peer review) for purposes of preventing and handling dispensing errors.

CVS/Pharmacy #6892, Pharmacy License No. 24599, Austin, TX. Alleged violation: dispensing error. Agreed Board Order accepted by licensee and entered by the Board on 08-04-15: license reprimanded and must develop and implement a Continuous Quality Improvement Program (to include peer review) for purposes of preventing and handling dispensing errors.

CVS/Pharmacy #6901, Pharmacy License No. 24840, Gainesville, TX. Alleged violations: dispensing error; failed to evaluate and identify the clinically significant high dosage; and failed to provide verbal patient counseling. Agreed Board Order accepted by licensee and entered by the Board on 08-04-15: license reprimanded; fined \$3000; and must develop and implement a Continuous Quality Improvement Program (to include peer review) for purposes of preventing and handling dispensing errors.

CVS/Pharmacy #7729, Pharmacy License No. 24755, Cameron, TX. Alleged violations: dispensing errors, including a delivery error; failed to provide adequate security for confidential patient records; and resold an erroneously delivered prescription after the prescription was

returned to the pharmacy. Agreed Board Order accepted by licensee and entered by the Board on 08-04-15: 2-year probation with conditions; fined \$3000; and must develop and implement a Continuous Quality Improvement Program (to include peer review) for purposes of preventing and handling dispensing errors.

CVS/Pharmacy #7756, Pharmacy License No. 24763, Galveston, TX. Alleged violations: failed to provide verbal patient counseling and a pharmacy technician asked a question of a patient that screened or limited interaction with a pharmacist. Agreed Board Order accepted by licensee and entered by the Board on 08-04-15: license fined \$3000 and must develop and implement policies and procedures to ensure that pharmacist personnel provide patient counseling.

Ly Thi Dang, Pharmacist License No. 35649. Alleged violations: while working at CVS/Pharmacy #7729 in Cameron, TX, committed dispensing errors, including one delivery error; failed to provide adequate security for confidential patient records; and resold an erroneously delivered prescription after the prescription was returned to the pharmacy. Agreed Board Order accepted by licensee and entered by the Board on 08-04-15: 2-year probation with conditions; fined \$2000; must obtain additional CE; and must successfully pass Pharmacist Assessment for Remediation Evaluation (PARE).

Green Oaks Hospital, Pharmacy License No. 19225, Dallas, TX. Alleged violation: failed to establish and maintain effective controls against diversion or loss of controlled substances. Agreed Board Order accepted by licensee and entered by the Board on 08-04-15: license fined \$1000 and must develop and implement policies and procedures to detect shortages and prevent theft and loss of controlled substances.

Samuel Ambrosio Gurrola, Pharmacist License No. 20097. Alleged violations: as pharmacist-in-charge and owner of Palafox Pharmacy in Anthony, TX, dispensed prescription refills pursuant to invalid prescription orders; dispensing and labeling errors; and failed to provide verbal patient counseling. Agreed Board Order accepted by licensee and entered by the Board on 08-04-15: 5-year probation with conditions and fined \$5000.

H.E.B. Pharmacy #029, Pharmacy License No. 25757, West Lake Hills, TX. Alleged violations: dispensing (delivery) error; failed to provide adequate security

for confidential patient records; improperly delegated a duty to a pharmacy technician; and failed to properly keep and maintain adequate pharmacy records. Agreed Board Order accepted by licensee and entered by the Board on 08-04-15: license reprimanded; fined \$3500; and must develop and implement a Continuous Quality Improvement Program (to include peer review) for purposes of preventing and handling dispensing errors.

H.E.B. Pharmacy #444, Pharmacy License No. 21156, San Antonio, TX. Alleged violations: dispensing error and failed to adequately follow-up with patient. Agreed Board Order accepted by licensee and entered by the Board on 08-04-15: license reprimanded; fined \$1500; and must develop and implement a Continuous Quality Improvement Program (to include peer review) for purposes of preventing and handling dispensing errors.

John David Herber, Pharmacist License No. 38272. Alleged violation: disciplinary action taken by the Oklahoma State Board of Pharmacy. Agreed Board Order accepted by licensee and entered by the Board on 08-04-15: 1-year probation with conditions.

Infusion Services & Specialty Pharmacy, Pharmacy License No. 25430, Mansfield, TX. Alleged violation: dispensed compounded sterile preparations when the pharmacy did not possess a Class A-S license. Agreed Board Order accepted by licensee and entered by the Board on 08-04-15: license fined \$1000.

Alleged violations: as pharmacist-in-charge at Tom Thumb Pharmacy #2557 in Gainesville, TX, failed to evaluate and identify clinically significant known allergies; allowed a pharmacy technician to override an alert regarding a patient's allergy; and failed to provide verbal patient counseling. Agreed Board Order accepted by licensee and entered by the Board on 08-04-15: 2-year probation with conditions and fined \$2000.

Larry D. Labove, Pharmacist License No. 19777. Alleged violation: as pharmacist-in-charge and corporate president of Tristar-Cleveland in Cleveland, TX, dispensed controlled substances pursuant to invalid prescription orders. Agreed Board Order accepted by licensee and entered by the

Board on 08-04-15: 3-year probation with conditions; fined \$7500; and must successfully pass the pharmacy law exam.

David Matthew Lansford, Pharmacist License No. 26410. Alleged violation: disciplinary action taken by the New Mexico State Board of Pharmacy. Agreed Board Order accepted by licensee and entered by the Board on 08-04-15: license reprimanded.

Donna Ruth Lewis, Pharmacist License No. 50467. Alleged violations: as pharmacist-in-charge of CVS/Pharmacy #7756 in Galveston, TX, failed to provide verbal patient counseling and allowed a pharmacy technician to ask a question of a patient that screened or limited interaction with a pharmacist. Medi-Stat Rx, Pharmacy License No. 26433. Alleged violation: disciplinary action taken by the Alabama State Board of Pharmacy. Agreed Board Order accepted by licensee and entered by the Board on 08-04-15: license reprimanded.

Joseph Hung Nguyen, Pharmacist License No. 42175. Alleged violations: as pharmacist-in-charge at Reliance Pharmacy in Houston, TX, failed to evaluate and identify the clinically significant duplication of drug therapy and drug-drug interaction of dispensed medication. Agreed Board Order accepted by licensee and entered by the Board on 08-04-15: license fined \$4000.

Elias Aman Okonkwo, Pharmacist License No. 29939. Alleged violation: as pharmacist-in-charge at Buckner Village Pharmacy in Dallas, TX, dispensed controlled substances pursuant to invalid prescription orders. Agreed Board Order accepted by licensee and entered by the Board on 08-04-15: 2-year probation with conditions and fined \$2500.

Erin Lea Onion, Pharmacist License No. 25924. Alleged violation: obtained prescription drugs without authorization of prescribing practitioner. Agreed Board Order accepted by licensee and entered by the Board on 08-04-15: license suspended for 14 days, followed by 2-year probation with conditions; and fined \$5000.

Palafox Pharmacy, Pharmacy License No. 26185, Anthony, TX. Alleged violations: dispensed prescription refills pursuant to invalid prescription orders; dispensing and labeling errors; and failed to provide verbal patient counseling. Agreed Board Order accepted by licensee and entered by the Board on 08-04-15: 5-year probation with conditions and fined \$5000.

Cynthia Yvonne Payne, Pharmacist License No. 25922. Alleged violations: improperly delegated a duty to a pharmacy technician while working at H.E.B. Pharmacy #029 in West Lake Hills, TX. Agreed Board Order accepted by licensee and entered by the Board on 08-04-15: license fined \$1000.

Marsha L. Proctor, Pharmacist License No. 31460. Alleged violation: as pharmacist-in-charge of Infusion Services & Specialty Pharmacy in Mansfield, TX, dispensed compounded sterile preparations when the pharmacy did not possess a Class A-S license. Agreed Board Order accepted by licensee and entered by the Board on 08-04-15: license fined \$1000.

Randalls Pharmacy #1858, Pharmacy License No. 21278, Pearland, TX. Alleged violation: shortages of controlled substances following accountability audit. Agreed Board Order accepted by licensee and entered by the Board on 08-04-15: license fined \$2000.

Reliance Pharmacy, Pharmacy License No. 26555, Houston, TX. Alleged violations: failed to evaluate and identify the clinically significant duplication of drug therapy and drug-drug interaction of dispensed medication. Agreed Board Order accepted by licensee and entered by the Board on 08-04-15: license fined \$6000.

Regina Ortiz Simien, Pharmacist License No. 42987. Alleged violations: as pharmacist-in-charge of Walgreens #10846 in Houston, TX, dispensing error and failed to evaluate and identify the clinically significant high dosage. Agreed Board Order accepted by licensee and entered by the Board on 08-04-15: 2-year probation with conditions; fined \$1000; and must obtain additional CE.

Specialty Compounding, LLC, Pharmacy License No. 25802, Cedar Park, TX. Alleged violation: violation of Federal Food, Drug, & Cosmetic Act. Agreed Board Order accepted by licensee and entered by the Board on 08-04-15: 2-year probation with conditions including: must develop and implement a Continuous Quality Improvement Program (to include peer review) for purposes of preventing and handling dispensing errors; develop and implement policies and procedures regarding the proper compounding of preparations; and retain a sterile compounding consultant to evaluate the pharmacy's operation with regard to medication safety and compliance with Board rules relating to the compounding of sterile preparations, who must submit reports to the Board.

Tom Thumb Pharmacy #2557, Pharmacy License No. 22132, Gainesville, TX. Alleged violations: failed to evaluate and identify clinically significant known allergies; allowed a pharmacy technician to override an alert regarding the patient's allergy; and failed to provide verbal patient counseling. Agreed Board Order accepted by licensee and entered by the Board on 08-04-15: 2-year probation with conditions and fined \$3000.

Tristar-Cleveland, Pharmacy License No. 15811, Cleveland, TX. Alleged violation: dispensed controlled substances pursuant to invalid prescription orders. Agreed Board Order accepted by licensee and entered by the Board on 08-04-15: 3-year probation with conditions and fined \$7500.

Tammi Sue Tucker, Pharmacist License No. 32194. Alleged violation: upon audit, failed to submit proof of completion of required and/or reported number of CE hours. Agreed Board Order accepted by licensee and entered by the Board on 08-04-15: license fined \$500; and must obtain additional hours of CE.

Walgreens #3441, Pharmacy License No. 10714, Houston, TX. Alleged violation: dispensing error. Agreed Board Order accepted by licensee and entered by the Board on 08-04-15: 2-year probation with conditions and must develop and implement a Continuous Quality Improvement Program (to include peer review) for purposes of preventing and handling dispensing errors.

Walgreens #03730, Pharmacy License No. 17051, Kerrville, TX. Alleged violation: shortages of controlled substances following accountability audit. Agreed Board Order accepted by licensee and entered by the Board on 08-04-15: license fined \$10,000 and must develop and implement policies and procedures to detect shortages and prevent theft and loss of controlled substances.

Walgreens #6857, Pharmacy License No. 21301, Houston, TX. Alleged violations: failed to provide verbal patient counseling; pharmacy technician asked a question of the patient that screened or limited interaction with the pharmacist; and pharmacy technician performed a duty that may only be performed by a pharmacist, in that the pharmacy technician communicated information about the dispensed drug to the patient. Agreed Board Order accepted by licensee and entered by the Board on 08-04-15: 2-year probation with conditions; fined \$4500; and must develop and implement policies and procedures to ensure that pharmacist personnel provide

patient counseling.

Walgreens #7720, Pharmacy License No. 22833, Spring, TX. Alleged violations: dispensing error and failed to provide verbal patient counseling. Agreed Board Order accepted by licensee and entered by the Board on 08-04-15: 2-year probation with conditions; fined \$1500; and must develop and implement a Continuous Quality Improvement Program (to include peer review) for purposes of preventing and handling dispensing errors.

Walgreens #11515, Pharmacy License No. 26331, Denton, TX. Alleged violations: failed to provide verbal patient counseling and improperly delegated to a pharmacy technician a duty which should only be performed by a pharmacist (allowed a Technician to contact prescribers to verify the accuracy of directions for use). Agreed Board Order accepted by licensee and entered by the Board on 08-04-15: 2-year probation with conditions; fined \$4500; and must develop and implement policies and procedures to ensure adequate and competent supervision of the pharmacy and of the pharmacy technicians by a pharmacist.

Walker Pharmacy, Pharmacy License No. 27066, Gladewater, TX. Alleged violation: shortages of controlled substances following accountability audit. Agreed Board Order accepted by licensee and entered by the Board on 08-04-15: license fined \$3000 and must develop and implement policies and procedures to detect shortages and prevent theft and loss of controlled substances.

Ragan Yvette Webster, Pharmacist License No. 41192. Alleged violation: as pharmacist-in-charge at Supreme Rx Pharmacy in Houston, TX, dispensed controlled substances pursuant to invalid prescription orders. Agreed Board Order accepted by licensee and entered by the Board on 08-04-15: license suspended the longer of 30 days or until she successfully passes the pharmacy law exam, followed by 5-year probation with conditions.

Walgreens #03848, Pharmacy License No. 10647, Deer Park, TX. Alleged violation: an employee to performed technician duties with no registration. Agreed Board Order accepted by licensee and entered by the Board on 08-20-15: license fined \$3000 and must develop and implement policies and procedures to verify the licensure and registration status for pharmacists, pharmacist interns, and pharmacy technicians.

Long Thanh Nguyen, Pharmacist License No. 42716. Alleged violation: as pharmacist-in-charge of Walgreens #03848 in Deer Park, TX, allowed an employee

to perform technician duties with no registration. Agreed Board Order accepted by licensee and entered by the Board on 08-31-15: license fined \$1000.

REHABILITATION ORDERS

Section 564.002 and 564.003 of the Pharmacy Act exempts from the Texas Public Information Act, the records of TSBP concerning pharmacists who have or have had an alcohol or drug dependency or who have developed an incapacity of a nature that prevents a pharmacist from engaging in the practice of pharmacy with reasonable skill, competence, and safety to the public.

Thus, Disciplinary Orders entered as a result of such impairments are confidential. Because of this confidentiality only the number of rehabilitation orders that have been entered by TSBP, will be published; the name of the pharmacist (and any pharmacy that is involved) is not published. Twelve such orders were entered by the Board from June - August 2015. This number may include the following types of orders:

(1) new orders entered on pharmacists who have or have had a chemical dependency, or mental or physical impairment;

(2) subsequent orders on these individuals; and

(3) orders entered on a pharmacy license as a result of violations or alleged violations by a pharmacist with an impairment.
