

## Third Party Payer Tutorial

The person or entity that is paying for the application fees will set up an online account with the Texas Licensing System. (Here is the link <https://licensing.hpc.state.tx.us/datamart/mainMenu.do>) When setting up the account you will be asked if you want to accept payment requests from third parties. I have attached an image below for reference.

### User Registration

Enter your details and press "Next".

Press "Previous" to return to the previous screen.

Press "Cancel" to cancel this registration and return to the main menu.
