

"Texas PMP – Create an Account" - Transcript

Narrator: This tutorial will go over how to create a user account in order to query patient data with the Texas Prescription Monitoring Program, also known as the PMP. Authorized users of the PMP include physicians, nurse practitioners, physician assistants, dentists, other prescribers, and pharmacists. In order to create an account, go to the Texas PMP aware site at texas.pmpaware.net and click Create an Account.

Narrator: Enter your email address and password, then confirm your password by entering it again. Your password must contain at least eight characters and include at least one capital letter, one lowercase letter, and one symbol. Enter your user role. For this example, we will use the physician role. However, the registration process for other users is much the same. Once you've selected your role, you will need to go to your email to verify your account.

Narrator: Click on the link. Now you can complete the registration process. Add your DEA number. Pharmacists do not have a personal DEA number, so will not need to provide a personal DEA number. However, pharmacists may provide an employer DEA number, but this is not required. If you have more than one DEA number, you may add additional numbers. You may also include your NPI or National Provider ID number.

Narrator: Add the last four digits of your Social Security number, your professional license number, and your date of birth. Indicate your license type. Since we're filling out this example form as a physician, we will select MD from the dropdown list. Include a phone number where you can be contacted in case we need to reach you. Then submit your registration.

Narrator: Once we are able to validate your registration, your account will become active and you will now be ready to access the Texas PMP and query your patients information. If your account is pending approval, you may contact the PMP at texaspmp@pharmacy.texas.gov or by phone at (512) 305-8050.
