Other Services Contracts also include the agency's annual contract for the Peer Assistance Program (services of \$186,260). This is another example of a contract significantly influencing the actual percent spent in Other Services Contract. This contract was competitively bid but only one vendor submitted a response and this vendor was not a HUB. TSBP has greatly increased usage of services from Analytical Research Laboratories as a result of SB 1100 (services of \$80,860) and Appriss-Healthcare (Development of Optimization of AWAREXE System (services of \$250,000); result of SB 195 – both self-performing and best value for the state. If we did not include the Peer Assistance Program, Analytical Research Laboratories, Appriss-Healthcare, the TSBP HUB utilization in Other Services would have been 13.02% in FY2016.
