## Newly Licensed (Initial Renewal) Pharmacist Continuing Education (CE) Requirement Breakdown

**Board Rule §295.8** 

# At least 2 total hours are required in your initial renewal period\*:

\*Your initial renewal period is considered the time period between your initial licensure and the renewal **after** your 30-day renewal (Board rule 295.8(b)(12)).

You **do not** need CE for the 30-day renewal period.



Per Board rule 295.8(d)(4)(A), you are **exempt** from the requirements below.



#### 2 Hours

Must be related to **prescribing and monitoring controlled substances** (as specified in House Bill 2174) and completed in the **first twelve months**\*\* of Texas licensure

\*\*Per HB 2174 (86R), pharmacists licensed on or after September 1, 2020 must complete the Controlled Substance CE **not later than the first anniversary of his or her licensure**.



#### **OTHER TRAINING REQUIREMENTS**

#### MANDATORY TRAINING

### **Human Trafficking Prevention Course Requirement:**

Each pharmacist must complete a human trafficking prevention course required in §116.002 of the Texas Occupations Code. As specified in House Bill 2059, 86<sup>th</sup> Legislature, Regular Session, the Executive Commissioner of the <u>Texas Health and Human Services Commission (HHSC)</u> shall approve training courses on human trafficking prevention, including at least one course that is available without charge. A list of the approved courses is posted on the <u>HHSC website here</u>. Newly licensed pharmacists are **not** exempted from this requirement.

#### **SUPPLEMENTAL (NON-MANDATORY) TRAINING**

House Bill 3285 (86R) mandates that the board encourage pharmacists to participate in a program that provides a comprehensive approach to the delivery of early intervention and treatment services for persons with substance use disorders and persons who are at risk of developing substance use disorders, such as a program promoted by the <u>Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration (SAMHSA)</u> within the United States Department of Health and Human Services. The Providers Clinical Support System (PCSS) is funded by a grant from SAMHSA and offers a free activity for pharmacists on its website: <u>Opioid Use Disorder and Pain Management Assessment Tool.</u>
