OTHER TRAINING REQUIREMENTS

MANDATORY TRAINING

Human Trafficking Prevention Course Requirement:

For renewals received after August 31, 2020 and before September 1, 2022, a pharmacist must have completed the human trafficking prevention course required in §116.002 of the Texas Occupations Code. As specified in House Bill 2059, 86th Legislature, Regular Session, the Executive Commissioner of the Texas Health and Human Services Commission (HHSC) shall approve training courses on human trafficking prevention, including at least one course that is available without charge. A list of the approved courses will be posted on the commission's internet website. Newly licensed pharmacists are **not** exempted from this requirement.

SUPPLEMENTAL (NON-MANDATORY) TRAINING

House Bill 3285 (86R) mandates that the board encourage pharmacists to participate in a program that provides a comprehensive approach to the delivery of early intervention and treatment services for persons with substance use disorders and persons who are at risk of developing substance use disorders, such as a program promoted by the <u>Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration (SAMHSA)</u> within the United States Department of Health and Human Services. The Providers Clinical Support System (PCSS) is funded by a grant from SAMHSA and offers a free activity for pharmacists on its website: Opioid Use Disorder and Pain Management Assessment Tool.
